

#### **From the Executive**

- \* Keys to be changed on the 1st Saturday of December with people needing to sign for their new key.
- \* Because of the proximity to Xmas if the Exec meeting is held on the 3rd Sat as per normal, it was decided to hold a Working Bee in the morning and an Exec meeting /Xmas function in the afternoon of the 1st Sat in Dec (3rd)
- \* Letter sent to Hutchings Trust requesting financial assistance for the Library.
- \* Scoop newsletter no longer to be mailed out to non members due to cost / time involved.
- \* Further revisions to the Constitution was presented which will be presented for acceptance at the next AGM.
- \* Plans for revision of the Printery / Whitcombe and Tombs Annex to provide space for the new Bindery were presented.
- \* Gary presented some ideas for what the Printery could offer on Nostalgia Day 2017 which was very successful for the Society this year - lots of new members as a result.
- \* A new software programme is being used to catalogue all Library books under a new catalogue system. This will be made available on a computer in the Library, allowing people to search for books in the Library on a particular topic.
- \* There is a need to have an upto-date Asset Register of all major plant and equipment the Society owns for Charity Funding applications. This will be developed in the coming months.

the Society. This equipment was recently shifted with the assistance of Murray Aspinall and is stored in the Linwood Store until we can assemble it as part of our printing display, this hopefully being achieved over the Xmas break.

## Ferrymead Printing Society Stolen / Missing?



There is a substantial reward offered by a Society member for any information about these missing posters / where they could have got to or anything that could help us recover them. If you are involved in the Print world, could you please spread the word.

It is a real tragedy that these were given to the Society in good faith that they would be treasured and preserved, and now these wonderful examples of a long lost art form and exceedingly valuable posters have been seemingly lost for visitors and members to enjoy and treasure.

A bundle of 1930s Art Deco posters have been removed or stolen from the Library in the Printery. These were part of a very large collection gifted to the Society many, many years ago by Clifford Barrell, a well known poster artist for Whitcombe and Tombs. Sadly, the majority of these wonderful Art Deco posters were stolen from the Printery many years ago and never recovered. The bundle that was left from the previous robbery was 're-discovered' a few years back when a group of students were helping Dr Judith Poirier sort out wooden type in the Printery loft. For temporary storage, until something could be done to allow the display of these very valuable items, they were placed in the Library. Some time between April and September, these were removed.



## **Register of Assets**

As part of our applications to Charity Funders for assistance with maintaining the building and repairing the inside of the Library, we need to have an Asset Register - a record of all major items of plant and equipment owned by the Society. This is going to be a very large task to record and value items within the Printery, but we are also aware that some members have items out on long term loan from the Society. Some of these loans, unfortunately, are seemingly not recorded. So we are reaching out to our Society members asking if they could let us know if they currently have items on loan from the Society. We are not wanting them back. We simply want to ensure we have an up to date record of these items and their approximately value for our Asset Register.
